Fair Lawn Takes Lead In Wrestling Tourney

Teaneck, Pascack Trail By One Point; Quarterfinal Round Slated Today

Oradell — The first annual Christmas Wrestling Tournament, sponsored by the Bergen County Coaches Association, opened last night at River Dell Regional High School

before 800 fans.

10 CUTTERS ADVANCE

Fair Lawn, with 16 points, took an early lead and sent 10 men into this afternoon's quarterfinal round. The wrestling action continues tonight at River Dell as the semifinals will start at 8 o'clock.

Fair Lawn was a surprise leader since pre-tourney forecasts labeled Teaneck and Pascack Valley as the teams to beat. The Big Blue and Indians were tied for second after last night's 83 matches with 15 points. Glen Rock, Tenafly, and host River Dell were close behind with 13, 12, and 11 respectively.

Early point totals were determined on the basis of one point for each advance and also single points for victory by fall, forfeit, or default. Any team which failed to enter each of the 12 weight classes was penalized five points for every class not contested.

In the final accounting a first place will count for 10 points, second seven, third four, and fourth two. Fair Lawn, with representatives in 10 of the 12 classes, joins with Teaneck and Pascack at tri-favorite.

There were 45 victories via the fall route on opening night. Among the winners was All-County football star Bob Pelsang of Pascack Valley. He dispatched Teaneck's Barry Tranchetti in 1:22 of a heavyweight clash.

The quickest pin of the evening was notched by Ed Moran of Paramus, who planted Charles Garavadian of Bergenfield to the canvas in 21 seconds. Other quickies went to Teaneck's Bill Hasse (50 seconds), Carl Danziger of Teaneck (42 seconds), Ramsey's Howard Zieller (47 seconds), River Dell's Robert Frueh (37 seconds), and Ramsey's Larry Barrett (42 seconds).

Today's quarterfinal round will be comprised of 48 matches and will start at 1 o'clock. Each wrestler will be given a 1-pound allowance. The 24 semifinal matches in the evening will qualify men for the finals and also for the consolation round to be held at 6 o'clock tomorrow.

Jack Armstrong, Tenafly mat coach, is tournament chairman. He is being assisted by other coaches in the area. The four officials were Fair Lawn's Frank Bennett, Rahway's Boaz Firkser, Fairleigh Dickinson's Bob Metz, and Columbia's Stan Thornton.

Teaneck Snares Crown In Wrestling Tourney

Edges Pascack Valley, 79 To 73, As S. R. O. Crowd Of 800 Looks On

Oradell - Teapeck High won the first annual Christmas Wrestling Tournament sponsored by the Bergen County Coaches Association last night at River Dell Regional High School before a standing-room-only crowd of more than 800 spectators.

Relying on depth, Teaneck second period, escaped for a neu-Valley which finished with 73. Glen Rock, Fair Lawn, and Tenafly completed the first five.

EACH WIN PAIR

Teaneck and Pascack, along with Fair Lawn, each had two individual champions, but the Big Plue success in the consolation round actually added up to its victory.

Teaneck's titlists were Carl Danziger at 106 pounds and Joe Murray in the 115-pound group. Pascack took its diadems in the final matches of the night with Dennis Reismann winning at 178 pounds and Bob Pelsang scoring his fourth straight fall to capture the heavyweight crown.

Fair Lawn's two champions were Richard (Rocky) Gilmore in the 98-pound class and Tom Borchino at 136 pounds. The other individual winners were Hawthorne's Lou Passaro, Lodi's Ray Barker, River Dell's Joe Fleming, Leonia's John Tiernan, Glen Rock's Charles Ingulli, and Ridgewood's Steve Leverich.

Teaneck went into last night's action with a slim 1-point edge over Pascack Valley, but when Bill Hasse, Ron Killgallen, and Ray Jobst triumphed in the thirdplace eliminations, the Big Blue carried a 6-point bulge into the

The large trowd settled down for the championship round and seemed to appreciate Gilmore's convincing decision over Lodi's Sam Grecco in the 98-pound class. Gilmore, strong and agile, showed prowess on his feet, in offensive riding position, and underneath. He won, 7-1 going away.

WINS CONVINCINGLY

Danziger, a District champ for Teanetk last year, won the 106-pound crown in convincing fashion. He pinned Ritigefield's Dave Wohlfarth with a half nelson and crotch at 3:59.

Murray, another Big Blue stalwart, added the 115-pound title to the Teaneck collection by stopping Tenafly's George Winterble, 5-1. Murray seemed to have the edge in the strength department and he reversed Winterble in the

scored 79 points to edge Pascack Hal and then took down the Tiger in the finale.

Hawthorne's Passaro was the lone member of the Passaic County squad to make the finals. He came out of the 123-pound battle with a strong 8-1 decision over Ramsey's Bob Spitler. Passaro had too much savvy for the game Ramsey grappler.

Perhaps the most exciting match of the evening was waged in the 130-pound class and it might have cost Pascack a shot at the tournament title. Lodi's Barker, hurt late in the-third period, returned to the mat and managed to hold off the Indians' Charles Hough to take a 6-5 win via time advantage. Barker built up more than a minute surplus in riding time to staye off a possible overtime battle.

Bocchino, an extremely rugged Cutter, had all the answers 26 seconds remaining, against Teaneck's John Wilson at 136 pounds. Bocchino came off with a handsome 6.2 decision, thanks to fine ability on his feet. He twice took Wilson to the mat for four of his six points.

Partisan River Dell rooters had something to shout about in the 148-pound event. Fleming, constantly in hot water, managed to nip Pascack's game Larry Nelson, 5-3, but only after a grueling 6-minute test. A third period reversal and riding time gave the host school grappler the de-

OVERTIME MATCH

Perhaps the strangest twist of events occurred in the 157-pound match between Glen Rock's Ingulli and Tenafly's Ken Méllin. The two, matmen struggled to a 1-1 deadlock in regulation time. In the two, 1-minute overtime periods, Ingulli tapped his reserve strength and eventually pinned Mellin at 1.38. All of this action followed a

brutal battle between Leonia's Tiernan and Teaneck's John Bertinatti at 148 pounds. Bertinatti. the pre-match favorite, fell be-hind_2-0 when Tiernan reversed him in the second period. The Teaneck grappler finally caught up with less than 30 seconds remaining in the bout when he too

If Reismann gave the noisy crowd a sample of strength, it was not until the final bout that it could see a strong man. Pascack's all-County football star, Bob Pelsang locked horns with Glen Rock's Jeff Scarles.
