Pascack Hills cops mat title

TEANECK — Pascack Hills claimed its first team championship in the 14-year history of the Bergen County Coaches Holiday Wrestling Tournament last night by scoring 68 points to top the 16-school field.

Defending champion Westwood finished fifth, behind Hackensack, Old Tappan and Passaic Valley.

The coaches named Rich Rausa of Old Tappan the outstanding wrestler. Rausa impressed with his pin of regional champion Kevin Carlisle of River Dell in the finals of the 141-pound bout. Rausa had rough going through all but the opening round. He pinned Car-

lisle in 4:41 to attract the attention of the judges.

Each of the three top schools had two winners, but it was Pascack Hills' better balance that prevailed. The Cowboys had two second-place finishers as well as a pair of champions. Hackensack and Old Tappan each had one runner-up.

The two Pascack Hills champions were Pat Montal bano at 129 and John Lindstrom at 170. In addition to Rausa, Old Tappan claimed a gold medalist in the unlimited class. There John Murburg won a title his brother Mike, now a Princeton freshman, never claimed.

Hackensack's winners were John Sabatini in the 148 division and Glen Candrilli in the 188. Other champions crowned were Art Kubo of River Dell (101), Kevin Cassedy of Ridgewood (108), Walt Jacome of Bergenfield (115), Tom Cafarella of Saddle Brook (122), Pete Lowenstein of Westwood (135), and Brian Collier of Pascack Valley (158).

Only one former winner was in the starting field of 192 entries Friday night, and he failed to survive the first round. Jim Keough of Westwood, the 98-pound champion in 1972, dropped a 2-1 decision to Chet Golembiewski of Pascack Hills in his first match in the 108-pound division.

Pascack Hills put four of its six semifinalists into the championship round, tops of any school. Hackensack and Old Tappan had three still in the running at that point. Teaneck and North Bergen, the only two schools that failed to land at least one finals berth, each had three in the consolations, as did Saddle Brook with one finalist.






Bergen Coaches honor Powley
