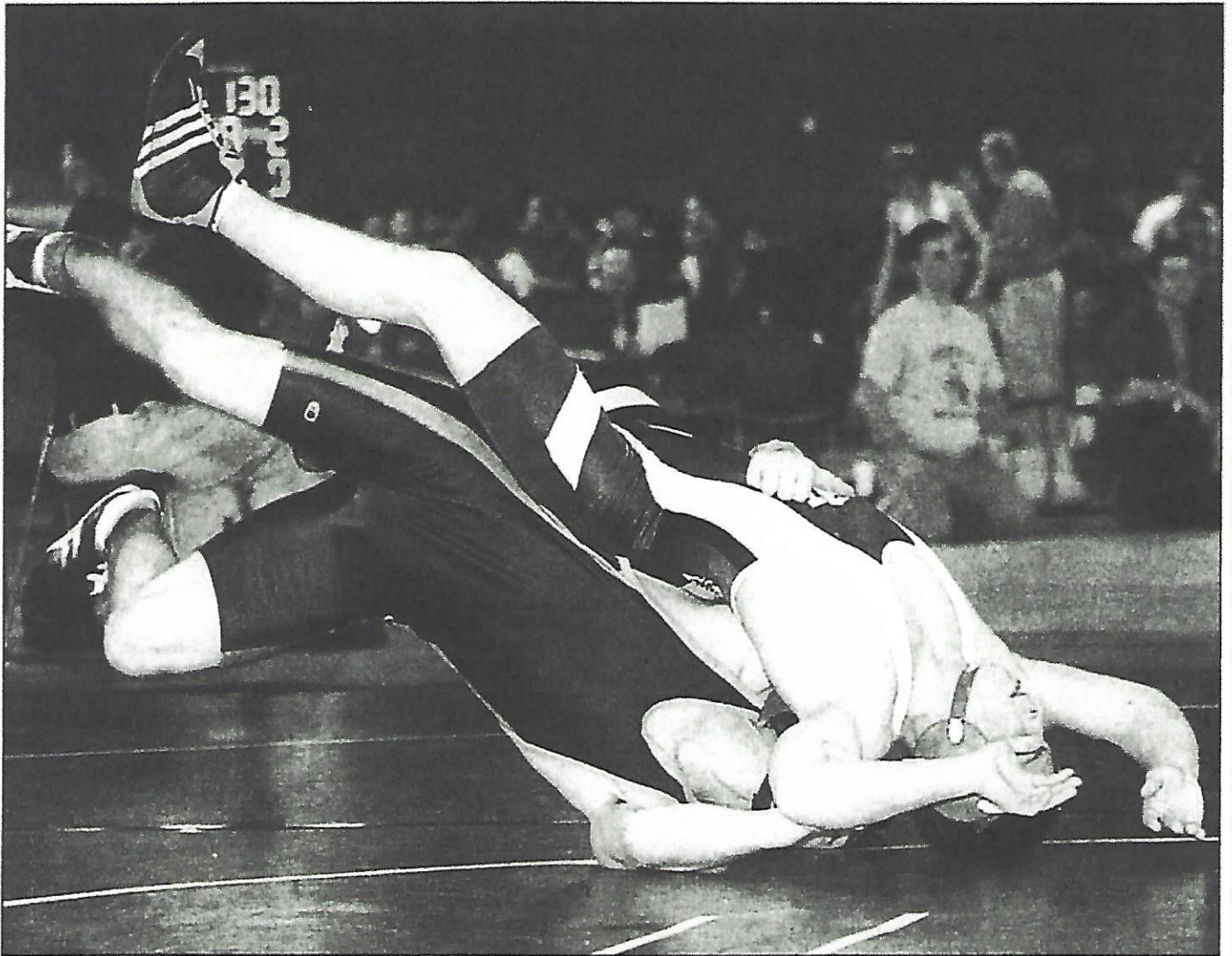

# Incognito finally making his tournament mark

TEANECK — Mike Incognito won 21 matches for Hasbrouck Heights/Wood-Ridge last year. But don't even ask him about the tournaments.

Three times he's been in the Bergen County Coaches Association Holiday Wrestling Tournament and three times he went home after the first round. He's come up empty in the district and region tournaments as well.

But this time around, the senior is trying to go out in style.

Incognito stunned Emerson/Park Ridge's David Misley with a pin in 4:09 and stopped Pascack Hills ace Adam Strobel in 1:05 to reach today's 135-pound semifinal at the Teaneck Armory.

Bergen Catholic, going for its fifth straight team title, holds a 15-point lead over St. Mary's, which is a surprise in second place, and 41 points over third-place Fair Lawn.

"I don't know how it feels," said Incognito, who was pinned by Strobel in the first round of last year's holiday tournament. "I've never felt

anything like this before. I wanted to win at least two matches. I didn't want to go home empty-handed."

That won't happen as Incognito clinched at least a fourth-place medal. He's hoping for more, but to do that, he will have to get past Ray Cottiers of New Milford, who pinned Ramapo's Lee Barden in 4:25 to reach the semifinals.

"You can't think about what he's done," said Incognito, whose cousin, also named Mike Incognito, failed to make it past the second round for the Aviators. "I have nothing to lose at this point."

Incognito wrestled like that Saturday, catching Misley with an underhook in the pre-quarterfinals and then stunning Strobel with a hip-toss in Saturday night's quarterfinal.

"He likes to catch his opponents in their own mistakes," Heights coach Mike Scuille said. "We've tried to work with him on mat strategy a little more. He used to be a whirlwind out there, trying every move he had in the first minute. If they worked, they worked. If they didn't, they didn't. We've gotten him to understand that his home run moves might

work better in the third period than in the first."

A couple of wrestlers hit home runs Saturday night, many wrestling for the third time in 10 hours.

Steve Rodriguez threw a wrench into a loaded 130-pound class with a 10-3 win over Westwood's second-seeded Anthony DePaola.

Cliffside Park's Turgel Guersel scored a takedown in the final minute for a 4-3 comeback win over Anthony Schiavelo of Leonia/Palisades Park in the 160-pound quarter.

"He's been a streaky wrestler for us," coach Marc Cabrera said of his senior. "He made the quarterfinals as a sophomore and a junior, but never got past them. What he's lacked is confidence. He needed a win that would give him confidence, and maybe this was the one."

Bergen Catholic and St. Mary's each put six wrestlers into this morning's semifinals. The Crusaders, with three-time champ Bryan Nunziato (125), Randy Dunkin (130), Derek Sickles (135), Spencer Kent (140), James Layman (189), and RJ Cummins (215), hold a 131.5-116.5 lead over the second-place Gaels.

# No sibling rivalry for Lodi duo

TEANECK – Lodi's Keith Dobish was wrestling on mat No. 2, but his mind was on mat No. 5.

Dobish's younger brother, Justin, was wrestling in the 189-pound Bergen County Coaches Association tournament quarterfinals at the same time Keith was in the 215 quarterfinals. Keith scored a pin in 52 seconds and then walked 10 feet, just in time to see his brother get dropped in 2:14. Keith winced when his brother fell, but was still proud of him.

"He is coming off of ACL surgery and is making a nice comeback," said Keith, a sophomore.

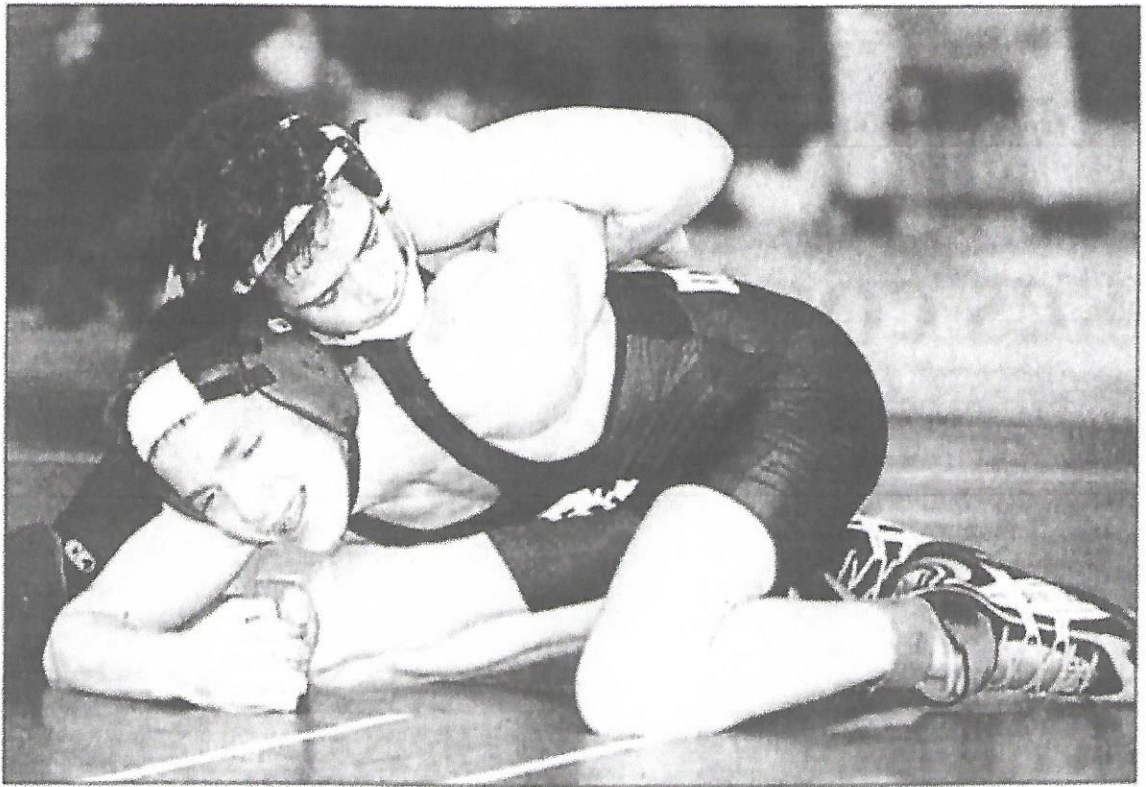
Keith Dobish's performance was not a surprise. He was sixth in this event last season, and competed heavily during the off-season to prepare for this event.

"You have to start ahead of time. You feel better when you start ahead of time," said Keith.

Keith won his first-round bout in 18 seconds, one of the quickest of the day, and followed that with a 16-4 thumping of Mike Schlossberg of River Dell. On the mat in the quarterfinals, Dobish slammed Steve Veyland of Bergen Tech in 52 seconds, explaining he was in a hurry to see his brother compete.

For Justin this was his best day, and showed that there are two Dobish brothers to be feared.

"This is the closest we have ever been together weight wise," said

Keith. "We have always been a couple of classes apart. We spar with each other."

Lodi assistant coach Brian Long feels the sky is the limit for the two brothers.

"They are very competitive with one another. Their work ethic is tremendous," said Long. "They are very hard-nosed kids. They have really busted their butts all year."

One of the biggest surprises of

the day was the performance of St. Mary's. The Gaels placed six wrestlers in today's semifinals, and are 15 points behind four-time defending champ Bergen Catholic in the team standings.

Gaels' 125-pounder Jim Grant plowed through Frank Buena-fuente of Garfield, 21-8, to reach the semis, but stormed off the mat afterward.

"I wasn't mentally prepared,"

said Grant. "I wrestled a bad match."

Bergen Catholic's Bryan Nunziato is the top seed at 125 pounds and Gaels' coach Scot Weaver said it would be great for Grant to face Nunziato.

"He is the measuring stick," said Weaver. "Bryan Nunziato is at another level."

Northern Highlands' freshman Fred Santaite weighs just 85 pounds, but he used every ounce to reach the semis with an 8-4 win over Mike Lupo of Bergen Tech. He'll face St. Joseph's Mike Trumbetti in the semis. Trumbetti pounded Waldwick/Midland Park's Oscar Yali, 18-4, in his quarterfinal. River Dell's Matt Szucs got by a tough challenge from Bergen Catholic's Chris Battaglia in the second round and defeated Northern Valley at Old Tappan's Kyle McSweeney to make the semis.

## 112

St. Mary's Bo Ryan pinned three straight opponents en route to a semifinal berth. Ryan took care of Ramsey's Stephen Andolena in 3:06 in the quarterfinals. Jon Weber of Westwood held off a game Aaron Khan in the quarterfinals, 7-2, to reach the semis. Dan Glover of Bergenfield and Cliffside Park's Isaac Golubchin also won decisions to reach today's semifinals.

## 119

St. Mary's sophomore Dave Greenwald dominated the top part of the 119 bracket. After a first-round bye, Greenwald pinned Hackensack's Nick Allegretta in 32 seconds and won an impressive tech fall in 2:47 over Jeff Saslowsky in the quarterfinals. Mahwah's Brad Arlington narrowly defeated Northern Highlands' Tom Piccininni, 5-2, in the semis.

## 125

Top seed Ryan Nunziato of Bergen Catholic won all three of his bouts in the second period, two by technical fall. Nunziato will face Don Bosco's John Dack in the semis. Dack pinned John Murray of Ridgefield Park/Ridgefield in 1:05 in the quarterfinals.

## 130

Steve Rodriguez of North Bergen defeated Anthony DePaolo of Westwood, 10-3. DePaolo pinned Rodriguez last season in the prequarterfinals when Rodriguez was leading the bout 8-0. Fair Lawn's Ken Giancola edged Becton/Wallington's Rob Kein, 5-2, in his quarterfinal bout.

## 135

The other Mike Incognito, from Hasbrouck Heights/Wood-Ridge, advanced to the semis with a pin of Adam Strobel of Pascack Hills in 1:05. New Milford's Ray Cottiers stormed through his part of the draw, winning two decisions and gaining a pin of Lee Barden of Ramapo in the quarterfinals in 4:25.

## 140

In a bout frequently stopped because of injuries, Bergen Catholic's Spencer Kent held off rugged Paul Forlai of Elmwood Park, 7-4. Kent was favoring a sore right ankle, while Forlai's lip was cut early in the bout. Fair Lawn's Joe Schick needed 39 seconds to defeat Pascack Valley's Jason Horowitz in the quarterfinals to move on.

## 145

Three of the top four seeds advanced into the semifinals, but it was a battle for returning County runner-up Roberto Celis of Northern Highlands. Celis went into overtime with returning district champion Ricky Jones of Westwood before scoring a 6-4 victory. Top two seeds Nick Brandreth of Emerson/Park Ridge and Brad Marquart of Rutherford each posted three pins through the quarterfinals. Brian Innis of St. Mary's pinned third-seeded John Randazzo of Paramus in the prequarterfinals and edged Jim Schultz of Ramapo, 10-8, in the quarters.

## 152

Fourth-seeded Rick Eichenlaub of Pascack Hills won three bouts, the final by a 6-4 score in overtime, to reach the quarterfinals. Second-seeded Everett Sayers of Pascack Valley had to hold on for a 4-3 victory over River Dell's Eamon Martin in his third bout of the day to reach the semifinals. Top-seeded Andrew Barnish of St. Joseph pinned in both his bouts, and third-seeded Dan Woods of Northern Valley at Demarest had two pins and a major decision.

## 160

Top-seeded Lior Zamir of Fair Lawn, a returning fifth-place finisher, pounded his way into the semifinals with three straight pins, only one going into the third period. He will face Bryan Fill of Hasbrouck Heights/Wood-Ridge, who followed up a pair of first-period pins with a 7-5 victory over fourth-seeded Chad Van Dyk of Ramapo in the quarterfinal. Second-seeded Ben Davidson of St. Joseph had two pins and a 10-7 decision in the quarterfinal. He will face Turget Guersel of Cliffside Park, who came back for a 4-3 victory over third-seeded Anthony Schiavello of Leonia/Palisades Park in the quarterfinals.

## 171

Unseeded Ed Dolan of St. Mary's and Yony Noy of Fair Lawn battled their way through the bottom bracket. Dolan scored three straight decisions, the third over Dumont's Mike Westphal, who had pinned second-seeded James Brock of Hackensack in the prequarterfinals. Noy rolled past fourth-seeded Ricky Keenan of Bogota, 9-0, in his quarterfinal. Top-seeded Greg Osgoodby of Waldwick/Midland Park had two pins and a 13-4 decision in the quarterfinal. He will face fourth-seeded Kevin Moran of Paramus, who had two pins.

## 189

James Layman, who has had a history of winning big bouts for Bergen Catholic, pinned fourth-seeded Cesar Fernandez of Ridgefield Park/Ridgefield to earn a shot at second-seeded Dillon Landi of Fair Lawn in the semifinals. Landi rolled past Ridgewood's Jason Eliya, 17-5, in his quarterfinal. Top-seeded Rich Vitale of River Dell posted three pins in a combined 4:36 to reach the semifinal where he will face third-seeded John Elia of Pascack Valley. Elia also had three pins.

## 215

Top-seeded Keith Dobish of Lodi had two pins in under a minute and posted a 16-4 major decision in his other bout to roll into the semifinal against Dumont's Sean Lissemore. Lissemore scored a 16-1 technical fall over fourth-seeded Brian McElroy of Northern Valley at Demarest and didn't give up a point in his next two bouts to reach the quarterfinal. Second-seeded RJ Cummins of Bergen Catholic scored three pins, two of them coming in 18 and 16 seconds, to reach the semifinals. He will face James Cullere of Indian Hills, who also posted three pins going into the semifinals.

## 275

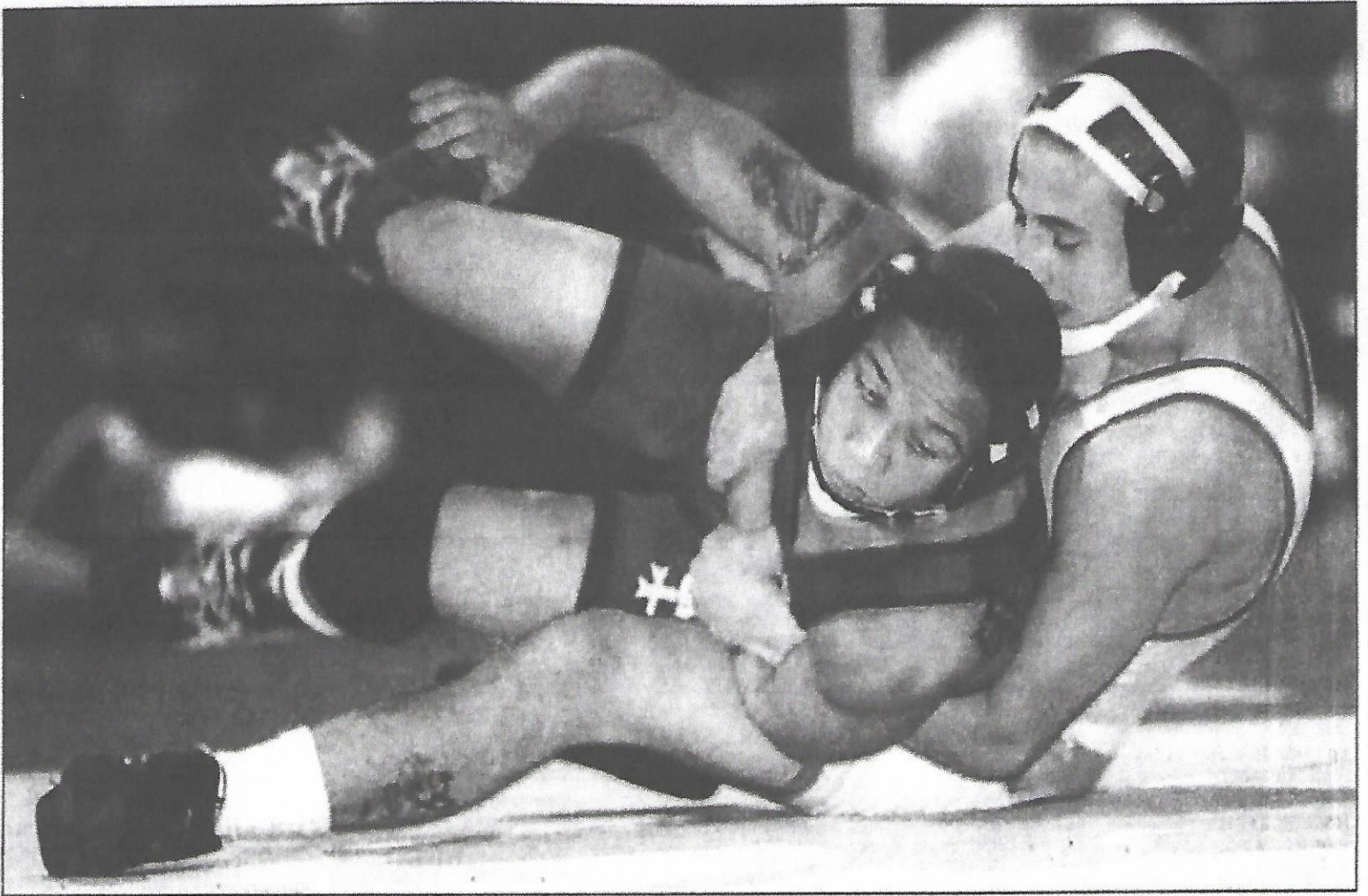
Fourth-seeded Mark Fersa of Saddle Brook took down Joe Hamm of River Dell with four seconds left in regulation to post a 4-2 quarterfinal victory. He draws top-seeded Diego Crespo of Paramus Catholic, who pinned in 3:45 and 37 seconds in his two bouts. Second-seeded Eric Sewell of Hackensack had three first-period pins to reach the semifinal where he will face third-seeded Ken Dryden of Emerson/Park Ridge. Dryden had a first-period pin and a 6-3 decision.

# Nunziato wins 4th

# Victory helps Bergen Catholic take team title

TEANECK – Bryan Nunziato did what he always does after scoring a 13-1 decision over St. Mary's Jimmy Grant on Sunday night at 125 pounds. He got up, shook hands, and hugged his friend before walking off business as usual.

But the scene was anything but ordinary as the Bergen Catholic senior became just the fourth person in the 44-year history of the Bergen County Coaches Association Holiday tournament to win four titles.

"It's great because it's only been done three other times," said Nunziato, who joined the illustrious company of Jason Hernandez [Bergen Catholic], Erik Norgaard [St. Joseph], and Chris Bitetto [Hackensack]. "Just to be mentioned with

that group is an honor because they're all State champions. I'm still working on that."

The win clinched the fifth straight team title for Bergen Catholic, which beat surprising second-place finisher St. Mary's, 171-155.5. St. Joseph, with a tournament-high three champs, finished third with 133.

For Nunziato, the tournament was just the first step on the road to his ultimate goal of a State championship. He's finished second each of the past two years.

"I joke to people that I'd rather not wrestle than finish second again," he said.

"I finished one [win] away twice. I'm more determined. Nobody's going to beat me this year."

That started with the holiday tournament as he won his fourth straight title and the Most Outstanding

Wrestler award while hardly being challenged.

Twice he put second-seeded Grant, a district champ and second in the regionals, on his back, cruising to his fifth win of the two-day tournament. Ironically, Nunziato and Grant both live in Carlstadt and practice at the same club.

"When you wrestle, you forget who your friends are," Nunziato said.

The win clinched the title for Bergen Catholic, which voted to skip the national-level Beast of the East tournament in Delaware last weekend because of a State rule limiting teams to one tournament in a week.

If not for Nunziato, BC's Derek Sickles would have been the hero of the day, scoring a last-second take-down in the semifinal to beat returning champion Cory Dunn of Rutherford, 4-3, and then rolling over return-

ing region champ and top-seeded Ray Cottiers of New Milford, 12-2.

"I think everybody respected Bryan enough to vote to come here and see him do this," BC coach Dave Bell said of the decision to skip the Beast.

"It was also a respect to our commitment as a Bergen County team to compete in a tournament sponsored by the Bergen County coaches."

St. Joseph led the way with three County champions, including freshman John Trumbetti, who beat top-seeded Matt Szucs of River Dell, 7-2, at 103 pounds.

"He's going to go a long way in this sport," said St. Joseph coach Bucky Rehan. "He's one of those kids who was always hanging around our gym."

# Lodi's Tirico keeps eye on the prize

TEANECK — Lodi's Sal Tirico got off to a rough start. He had a contact lens knocked out in the first period and with time running out in the bout didn't know what to do.

So he took his other contact lens out, too.

Tirico, who just started wearing contacts a month ago to correct his poor vision — "I can't see the scoreboard over there," he says, pointing 10 yards away. After attempting to put his lost lens back in without success in his 130-pound championship match with Bergen Catholic's Randy Dunkin, he managed to see his way to a 7-3 win and claim his first Bergen County Coaches Association Wrestling Tournament title.

As many expected, Bergen Catholic took its fifth straight team title in the tourney, but Lodi had a big night, finishing as one of just three schools with multiple champions — Tirico and 215-pounder Keith Dobish.

Tirico, a sophomore, had to survive the rugged draw at 130-pounds and faced Dunkin in the final. Dunkin defeated Tirico in the regional consolations last year.

Tirico was nursing a slim 5-3 lead with 30 seconds left in the bout and the momentum appeared to be swinging toward Dunkin, but instead of wrestling conservatively, Tirico attacked, snagging a single leg and getting a clinching two-point takedown with 19 seconds left.

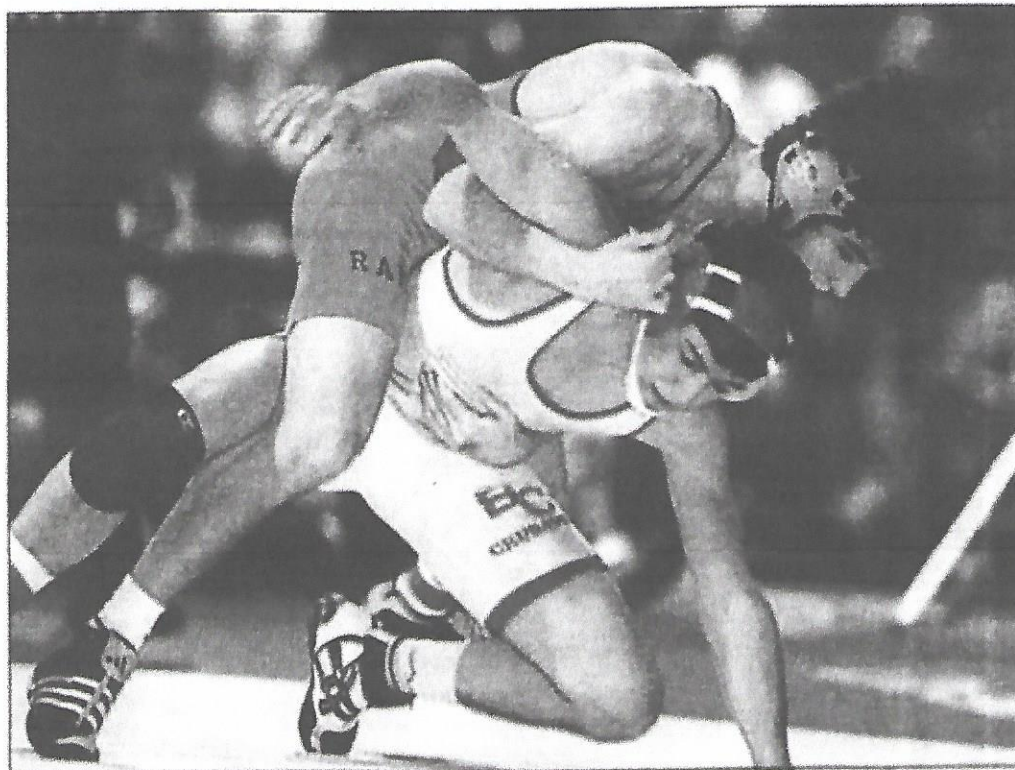
"I kind of had to snap myself out of it," said Tirico. "I have a habit of when I have a lead, I start to wrestle defensively, but I knew I could get a takedown because I was in better shape."

Tirico also provided one of the lighter moments of the night, pointing his thumb downward in response to a referee's call for stalling in the second period. Tirico didn't agree with the call, but was lucky he wasn't penalized for his brief demonstration.

"I really shouldn't have done that," said a smiling Tirico.

Dobish was the top seed at 215 pounds, but also faced a stiff challenge in the final from Indian Hills' James Cullere. In an uneventful match, Dobish got the lone double-leg takedown to seal a 4-1 win.

"He's a good wrestler," Dobish said of Cullere. "He has good hips and he's kind of short, so I was having

trouble getting my regular shots on him. I kept trying to turn him and he kept stalling, so I really made my points down low."

It was the first title for the sophomore.

"It feels good," Dobish said. "This is another step on the way to a State title."

St. Mary's sophomore Dave Greenwald was expressing a similar sentiment after his impressive 10-2 win over Darryl Cocozzo of River Dell in the 119 final.

"You'll be seeing me in the State finals," said Greenwald.

First, Greenwald had to get through Cocozzo. The two had wrestled one another when they were younger, with Cocozzo getting the upper hand, but

Sunday, Greenwald systematically built a lead, scoring takedowns in each period to win 10-2.

"I never really beat him," said Greenwald. "This is the first time I beat him in a while."

"He has a great commitment to win," Gaels' coach Scot Weaver said of his champion. "That just shows you what off-season commitment does."

Buoyed by Greenwald's title and Jim Grant's second-place finish in 125, the Gaels finished second behind Bergen Catholic. It was the highest finish for the program under Weaver.

"That's a nice thing to happen," said Weaver. "Am I looking for that? No. But it's a nice thing to happen."

Riding the momentum of a dramatic semifinal win over Rutherford's Cory Dunn, Derek Sickles of Bergen Catholic posted a 12-2 victory over New Milford's Ray Cottiers in the final. Dunn came back in his third-place match with Mike Incognito of Hasbrouck Heights/Wood-Ridge, beating Incognito, 12-2.

St. Joseph's Rory O'Donnell kept Fair Lawn's Joe Schick off balance throughout the final and won a pin in 4:41. It was the seniors' second Bergen coaches title and improved his career record to 87-20. In the third-place match, Bergen Catholic's Spencer Kent was disqualified, giving St. Mary's Bob Cannici the win.

Returning third-place finisher Nick Brandreth of Emerson/Park Ridge moved up two spots on the award stand by pinning Brad Marquart of Rutherford in 5:55.
