I was introduced to scholastic wrestling during my 8th grade physical education class by Mr. Stan Woods. He had a mat rolled out and said, "the girls are going to do tumbling, and the boys are going to wrestle today". After doing very well against my opponents and not knowing how to really wrestle, I felt good about myself. The next time I saw him in the hallway he said to me. "Hey Key, I signed you up for wrestling". I said "OK", kept walking to class and never looked back again. I earned a Varsity letter my last three years of my career. Soon after graduation, I started volunteering my time to the rec program during my younger brothers' time there. In 1987, I was named Head Wrestling Coach/Program Director and kept that position for the next 13 years. While participating in the Twin County Junior Wrestling League, I was named Vice President in 1998, and took over the Presidency in the 2000-2001 season. I held that position until 2003, when I became Head Wrestling Coach at Elmwood Park High School. In the 2005-06 season at EP, we set the school single season record for wins with a 22-2 record and made it to the North 2 Group 2 Team State Sectional Semi-finals. In 2007, I became HWC at Bergen Tech HS. In 2008, I was named Co-Head Coach of the Ridgefield Park/Ridgefield co-op program and stayed there until March of 2013. In the summer of 2013, I was named HWC of Hudson Catholic HS in Jersey City. After 2 seasons of trying to build the program, with declining overall school enrollment, Hudson Catholic decided to drop wrestling and ice hockey. After that, I was an assistant coach at Ramapo HS from 2015-2017 under current HWC Brian Gibbs.

All throughout the years, I continued my working relationship with the Twin County Junior Wrestling League by helping build it from 25 teams in 1987 to 53 teams today. I have served as Head Coach/Program Director, VP, President, District 1 Director, Asst. Regional Director, Computer Assistant, Weigh-Master, Trustee, Referee, Awards Chairman and Coaches' Dinner Chairman. My love for the sport of wrestling and watching my student athletes grow physically, mentally, emotionally and socially has been extremely satisfying. Wrestling builds character, confidence and teaches many life skills along the way to a positive and productive lifestyle.
