Tourney to honor official

PARAMUS — Officiating the Bergen County Coaches Holiday tournament has special meaning for Bob Whitaker.

"It's a very prestigious tournament, so it's an honor just to be selected to work in it," Whitaker said between preliminary-round matches Sunday. The tournament committee considers Whitaker special enough that it will present him with the William F. Powley Memorial Service To Wrestling Award prior to tonight's championship round. Whitaker is the first honoree to also have been a County champion.

PRELIMINARIES

Whitaker was an unbeaten State 120pound champion as a high school sophomore in his native Oklahoma in 1963. His family moved to New Jersey the next year, and wrestling for Ridgewood, Whitaker won the Bergen title at 123 pounds in 1964 and another State title in March 1965.

"We had one of the best teams in the state my junior year at Ridgewood," said Whitaker, who resides in Pine Brook with his wife and son. "Ten district champions and five region champi-

He was 47-1-1 in New Jersey and placed in the Big 8 Conference championships for the University of Oklaho-

The first surprise in the preliminaries was at 215 pounds, where Paramus Catholic freshman Dan Farina of East Rutherford nipped taller Emerson-Park Ridge veteran Tim Van Overloop, 4-3. It was Farina's second varsity match following a loss last week against Belle-

"I'm a Farina," was his explanation for success, noting that uncles Jim and John Farina were standout athletes at Becton, and his father, Frederick, also played football and wrestled. "I give up 20 pounds in this weight class, but in my junior program until last year, I was always wrestling against bigger, stron-

ger kids. He is a two-time junior regional winner and last year's intermediate 180pound State champion, who weighed in Sunday at 196. However, Farina was pinned in the second round by last year's Bergen County freshman champion, Brian Diorio of Indian Hills. . . . Becton's 103-pound Mike Decio won, 5-3, in overtime over Mahwah's third-

seeded Joey Pedevill.

NOTES — Another freshman with a background is Brian Lucas of Bergen Catholic, who ousted Pascack Hills' fourth-seeded Mike Kraycinovich, 5-4, with a frontal head and leg takedown. ... While Dumont lost out when Lucas chose BC, the Huskies held onto Anthony Dunkin, who battled tooth and nail with State junior champion Steve Hult before being pinned in their secondround bout.

There were handshakes galore for new St. Mary's coach Kurt Montanye. who previously coached at Montclair. He won a Bergen title at 160 pounds for

Fair Lawn in 1989. "It's great to be back home in Bergen County," he said. . . Cliffside Park's fourth-seeded 152pounder Zeke Hernandez said he learned from watching teammate Oliver Ruiz win the State 119-pound championship after stumbling in the regions. "You can't give up, even if people look at you and say you're not that good. It's all head and heart," he said after toughing it out by answering a reversal with one of his own for an 8-5 second-round win over rugged Mike Rothman of Riv-

Making the transition from a championship football season to the mat takes about a month, said Glen Rock's 189-pound Gerald Pascarelli. Two weeks into the season, Pascarelli was forced into overtime when taken down with five seconds left by Ridgefield's Kevin Tedesco. "Football's a lot of standing around, and wrestling is nonstop movement; it takes me about a month of hard work to get my wind and brush up on my moves," he said after winning, 12-10, in OT with a double-leg takedown in Paramus High's brutally hot auxiliary gym. Glen Rock, which

forfeited the first three weight classes last year, is fielding a full lineup this

One of the earliest showdowns saw St. Joseph 171-pound Matt Romeo decision Don Bosco Prep's third-seeded Bryan DeSousa, 9-5, in the first round. A second-round matchup of major talents saw top-seeded 189-pound Kyle Good of Indian Hills pin St. Joseph's Dustin DeMercurio in 3:00. ... Garfield's 103-pound quarterfinalist Rodney Yamet is no fresh-faced freshman. He's a senior who has been stuck behind major Boilermaker point-scorers Dave Salmond and Anthony Barber for years.

Pascack Hills was without four injured wrestlers, including Dennis Winters (arthroscopic knee surgery), who was third here last year. . . . Lyndhurst had a tough day - four wrestlers not making weight and one, Oguz Cifteibasi (152), being disqualified for flagrant fouls, costing his team the points he earned and costing him a suspension for his team's next two matches.

Fifth-place consolation and semifinal rounds begin at 11 a.m. today. Thirdplace consolations are 5:30 p.m. and fin-

Eight champions to defend County crowns

PARAMUS - Depending on their weigh-ins this morning, two or three returning champions could meet in the late rounds of the 39th annual Bergen County Coaches Association Holiday Wrestling Tournament at Paramus High School.

The excitement should center around either the 135- or 140-pound weight classes, involving Hackensack's Chris Bitetto (winner at 130 pounds last year), St. Joseph's Erik Norgaard (135), and Pascack Hills' Justin Frohlich (140). It all depends on their weights and inclinations. Will they drop to a lower weight class, move up, or stay put?

In case anyone drops to 130 pounds, another returning champion, Ramsey's Chris Brizzi, likely will be waiting. Pascack Valley's David Germakian, St. Joseph's Mike Palo, Ramsey's Phil DeBiasi, and Fort Lee's Brad Christie make it eight champions back to defend titles.

The team title figures to be decided by St. Joseph, Indian Hills, Pascack Hills, and Bergen Catholic. Nine Indian Hills wrestlers meet criteria for seeds as majortournament medalists. Paramus also has nine, but its best finish was no higher than district champion. Pascack Hills has eight and St. Joseph seven. BC has only five, and two of Hackensack's top six -County silver medalist Aashon Larkins and Chris Labrosse - are out while awaiting shoulder operations.

Like last year, 48 of 49 County teams will compete. However, Bogota has dropped out, while Wood-Ridge is back

after a one-year absence.

Here is a rundown of the names the coaches are talking about at each weight

103 - Pascack Valley freshman Steve Hult is a five-time Junior State champion, including last vear's National Juniors title. St. Joseph freshman Chris Lowe was second in the Gray Bee tournament at St. Benedict's. Hackensack's Gerard Carroll has more high school experience.

140 - Norgaard was fifth in the State, Frohlich was sixth, and Indian Hills' Steven Becker won a region medal for Fair Lawn. Also, Northern Valley at Demarest's Ed An, North Bergen's Anthony Falco, and Fort Lee's Spike Kim.

145 - John Lauterback of Northern Valley at Demarest, who might go at 140, lost a threepoint decision to Bitetto in last year's final. Also, Northern Valley at Old Tappan's Mike D'Andrea, Don Bosco Prep's Paul Siemon, Westwood's Adriatik Bajrushi, Indian Hills' Mike Massenzio, Ridgefield Park's Ceasar Maschang, and Leonia's Matt Morales.

152 - Ralph DeNisco of St. Joseph is mentioned. Challenging are Garfield freshman Ardian Ramadani, Cliffside Park's Zeke Hernandez, Westwood's Joe Murtaugh, and Don Bosco's Donald Gribben.

160 - State semifinalist Christie and DeBiasi would make a great finals match. Also, St. Joseph's Harry Gooch, Pascack Hills' Dennis Winters, BC's Mike Cook, Hackensack's Bryan Thompson, River Dell's Mike Quinn, Bosco's Jason Moses, and Ridgewood's Andrew Tuculescu.



Showdown in the making

PARAMUS - No one will say it out loud, but here's a not-so-well-kept secret. Wrestlers know who is in their weight class, and they do what they can to avoid certain wrestlers.

So while there will be some intriguing matchups today in the semifinals and finals of the 39th annual Bergen County Coaches Association Holiday tournament at Paramus High, the marquee matchup is expected to happen at 135 pounds.

That's where top-seed Chris Bitetto of Hackensack and second-seed Justin Frohlich of Pascack Hills are expected to meet in the final. Bitetto finished fourth in the State at 135 pounds as a freshman last season. Frohlich finished sixth in the state at 140 pounds last season and has dropped a weight class this season because his off-season workouts were curtailed by knee surgery.
"It would be a good matchup. But I

have to take it one match at a time. I'm not jumping into the final yet," Frohlich said. "I'm not saying I'm going to beat him and I'm not saying he's going to beat me. It should go back and forth.'

The bout would present an interesting contrast in styles. Bitetto is more of a scientific wrestler who utilizes his speed and uses leverage well. Frohlich has a powerful upper-body and relies more a Greco-Roman style of throws and trying to overpower his opponent.

Both wrestlers were impressive during the quarterfinals. Bitetto made short work of St. Joseph's Tom Murgalo, winning by pin in 1:21. Frohlich got Westwood's Alex Koh in a headlock and demonstrated his upper-body strength, taking him over into a pin at

"He doesn't want to walk through. He wants to meet some good wrestlers,'

Hackensack coach John Stallone said of Bitetto. "Chris has trained really hard. He's looking forward to good competition.

So is Erik Norgaard. The St. Joseph's 140-pounder pinned Bryan Friedman of Emerson-Park Ridge in 1:05, his third pin in less than two minutes in the tournament. Norgaard, a junior, wrestles year-round and won the 143-pound Freestyle State title over the summer. Frohlich was one of the wrestlers in that same weight class.

"This is warming me up for [today]. I don't look at the charts, I just wrestle whoever is in front of me on the mat,' Norgaard said. "My goal this year is not to be taken down once. Freestyle helps

with that.'

Had things been a little different, Bitetto, Norgaard, and Frohlich could have been in the same weight class for this tournament. All captured titles here last year, with Bitetto winning at 130, Norgaard at 135, and Frohlich at 140. Who do you make the third seed

out of that group?

But tournament organizers didn't have to deal with that dilemma.

There were only a handful of upsets in the quarterfinal rounds. All of the top seeds advanced, but two No. 2 seeds were eliminated. The most shocking result may have come at 103 pounds, where Steve Holt of Pascack Valley pinned No. 2 seed Jared Magka of Ramapo in 2:35. Adrian Ramadani of Garfield, the No. 7 seed, muscled his way into the semifinals with a 6-1 decision over Matt Morales of Leonia.

"This is like Christmas for these kids. Most kids can't sleep because they want to open presents. These kids can't sleep because they want to get out there, Stallone said of the first big tournament of the season. "This is the real Christ-mas celebration for these kids. They don't get to celebrate like us. Most good wrestlers are running Christmas night.





Indian Hills' Good is living up to his name

PARAMUS — Instead of being sent to his room without supper, Kyle Good served a different sort of punishment

this time last year.

The Indian Hills wrestler had arrived at the Bergen County Coaches Association Holiday tournament at slightly more than his 189-pound limit and was banished to the 215-pound weight class where he finished sixth.

Good's season wasn't ruined, but he feels he was never given the credit someone of his talent would normally merit after that early-season mistake. Good went on to finish seventh in the State at 189, but never seemed to be as highly regarded as many other North Jersey wrestlers.

It bugs him.

"I didn't get as much credit because of this tournament," Good said after defeating Nick Ponzini of Paramus in Monday's semifinal at Paramus High School. "This does a lot for your reputation because it's a tough tournament.

This time, Good didn't want to just live up to his name. His weight was where it should be, but he had to fight a hamstring injury suffered during a quarterfinal match against Gerald Pascarelli of Glen Rock and appeared to be completely spent after defeating Ponzini. Good lay on the mat for a few seconds and then practically had to crawl

Good spent part of his offseason training in Russia. The workouts lasted about seven hours a day. Good admits he got his butt kicked on a regular basis, but he returned with a wealth of knowledge and the realization that he can't rely solely on his power. The brain has

to be part of the equation.
"This is where you get your name," Good said. "Win this and people look

out for you."

SEMIFINALS

One of the most exciting bouts of the day happened at 152 pounds, where fourth-seeded Zeke Hernandez of Cliffside Park scored an 11-8 decision over top-seeded Ralph DeNisco of St. Joseph. DeNisco had won his previous two bouts by pin in 24 and 26 seconds, respectively.

Hernandez took the lead using switches from the bottom and catching DeNisco with two single-leg takedowns. Sensing an upset, the entire gymnasium roared in the final minute as Hernandez held on for the victory.

"I know I have to do it and beat the kid. There's no way I want to go home fourth or second or third," said Hernandez, last year's District 16 champion at 145 pounds. "It's a really awesome feeling. These are the best times in my life. I know I'm not going to get them back so I'm doing my best to live those.'

Hackensack junior Gerard Carroll is looking forward to his best season. Added weight is the difference. The added mass already is showing results, as Carroll advanced to the final of the 103-

pound class.

Carroll weighed in the 90-pound range last season, when he wrestled at 103. The disadvantage was especially noticeable against stronger wrestlers. While they have moved up to 112, Carroll remains at 103 with more experience and savvy against mostly younger competition.

"It's like moving him up a weight class," Hackensack coach John Stallone said. "This year he actually weighs the

Carroll has no idea why he can't keep

weight on. He is one of those few wrestlers who can chow down fast food whenever he feels the craving. He doesn't have to cut weight, though he has been above 103 on occasion. Prac-

tice usually takes care of those.
"I always eat. I just can't gain weight," said Carroll, who has to credit metabolism and not genetics. "My father is 6-foot, 280 pounds. He's big. I guess I haven't hit that growth spurt

NOTES — The seeds held true in seven of the 14 weight classes as No. 1 met No. 2 in the final. In all, 11 No. 1 seeds advanced to the final.

Perhaps the most unlikely final match was at 119, where No. 5 Jeff Alfonso of Garfield took on No. 6 Ryan Hult of Pascack Valley. Alfonso decisioned No. 1 seed Chris McDonnell, 7-5. Hult eliminated Vic Minassian of Westwood, 7-1, to reach the final.

St. Joseph wins title

PARAMUS — Even longtime wrestling followers were agog Monday as the championships of the Bergen County Coaches Wrestling Tournament unfolded. One bout, Chris Bitetto's repeat championship, will belong to the ages.

Two other competitors, Chris Brizzi of Ramsey and Erik Norgaard of St. Joseph, recorded rare achievements, becoming the 13th and 14th wrestlers in the 39 years of the tournament to win three titles.

Unsung Pascack Valley opened eyes by placing wrestlers in the first four championship bouts and coming away with three titles. Brothers Steve (103 pounds) and Ryan Hult (119) each pinned five opponents and came out as champions, and 112-pound Dave Germakian won his second straight title. PV teammate Justin Mezzadri (125) also made it to the finals, but fell victim to the brilliant Mike Palo of St. Joseph, 15-5.

The team title came down to the final bout, in which heavyweight Edgar Puzio took advantage of a mistake by John Currid of Pascack Hills to gain the winning takedown and allow his St. Joseph team to overtake Indian Hills for the championship, 194-193. Following the afternoon's semifinals and fifth-sixth consolations, Indian Hills held a 189-172 lead. St. Joseph pulled it out with wins in the finals by Norgaard at 140 pounds, repeat champion Palo at 125 pounds, and Puzio, who won in overtime when Currid seemed on his way to spinning around a single-leg miss for a takedown, but slipped and fell to his stomach. Puzio alertly leaped on him with 40 seconds left in overtime for the takedown and 6-4 win.

Bitetto, the Hackensack sophomore who already owns two County titles, was named Most Outstanding Wrestler of the 48-team, two-day tournament. He won a battle of returning State medal winners over Pascack Hills' Justin Frohlich for the 135 title. It was a match that reminded some of the classic battle in the early Eighties between Bergenfield's Pete Georgoutsos and Bergen Catholic's Tim Doherty, a great matchup that did not disappoint.

Former Becton and Lyndhurst coach Rich Vartan, the Region 4 representative to the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association, was among the many veterans fully entertained by what took place. "This is one of the greatest matches I've ever seen in the County," he said as the crowd roared following Bitetto's 18-17 win that wasn't assured until he took Frohlich to his back while locked in a Frohlich headlock with 11 seconds left.

To open the match, the acrobatic Frohlich notched a takedown off a nifty duckunder and built a 12-3 lead in the first period. The demonstrative Bitetto recalls it as a 13-2 score and won't soon forget the alarm that it caused.

forget the alarm that it caused.

"To look up at the clock and see it's
13-2 and the whole crowd's against you,
there's plenty of concern," he said. "He
[Frohlich] definitely is an outstanding
wrestler and somehow he got me on my
back early."

Interestingly, Frohlich scored most of his early points in a defensive position with spectacular escape moves, springing out and up to combat the pressure Bitetto applied. Bitetto began to turn the tables by using a snap move close to the mat to face Frohlich for a neutral point and then immediately snapping again to swing around his man for a takedown. He used that three-point series twice in the third period to cut the deficit to 17-13.

"I saw Tim Brandt of [the University of] Iowa use that in the National [Collegiate] finals," Bitetto said. "I figured it

was the fastest way for me to get my takedowns back."

Indian Hills had one champion, Austin Wall at 171 pounds. Northern Valley at Demarest's John Lauterback won at 145 pounds to move up from last year's silver medal — he lost to Bitetto in the

final round then. Zeke Hernandez of Cliffside Park won at 152, Brad Christie of Fort Lee repeated at 160 by downing another returning champion, Ramsey's Phil DeBiasi, 12-4.

Adam Sica of Lyndhurst stunned Indian Hills' State medal-winning top

seed, Kyle Good, 10-4, with a strong takedown attack. Matt Greenberg of Northern Highlands won at 215 pounds, 10-4, over Bergen Catholic standout Dom Santoli.

Mon Dec 28, 1998 St. Joseph wins second consecutive title

Following any dual meet or tournament, Pascack Valley coach Gary Beyer awards a Most Outstanding Wrestler Tshirt to a member of his team. The decision should have been more difficult Monday after PV placed finalists in the first four weight classes of the Bergen County Coaches Holiday Tournament and came away with three champions - brothers Stephen and Ryan Hult and repeat winner David Germakian — and a silver medalist, Justin Mezzadri.

Beyer, a former district and regional champion and County runner-up for Valley, says choosing senior 119-pounder Rvan Hult was not a difficult decision. "Ryan had to handle the added pressure,"

A year ago, after beating a returning State medalist the previous week, Hult lost in the County's first round to upcoming freshman standout Mike Palo of St. Joseph. That loss had to be on his mind entering this year's event, and there was even more pressure applied when his brother, a freshman, won the 103-pound title two bouts before Ryan took the mat.

"I felt a little pressure, but if he won and I lost, it would still be all right," the older brother said. "And if I won and he lost, I know it would be all right with my brother, too.'

Each Hult pinned all five of his opponents and Stephen won the Most Falls in the Least Amount of Time award by 23 seconds over his brother.

An evaluation process helped buoy Ryan Hult. He gauged the abilities of his opponents and believed he was better than any of them. "I just had a positive attitude. I know they don't work as hard

"They're both unorthodox wrestlers," Beyer said of the brothers. "They're longer in build, they use their hips more, and wrestle more with their legs; and they're both very aggressive.'

Stephen Hult is one of those cool freshmen who do not seem fazed by the step up to varsity. He won four straight State Junior Wrestling championships. He did notice a few differences. "Longer matches, and there weren't as many weight classes," he said, noting that junior matches go 41/2 or five minutes, compared to six minutes in high school; and that there is only one age group in high school, as opposed to many in junior tournaments.

Co-stars in the development of the brothers are uncles David Helfenbein, who wrestled for Beyer, and Joe Helfenbein, a weight-training expert.

UP A WEIGHT: Lyndhurst's Adam Sica missed his usual 171 pounds by two-fifths of a pound for the tournament, but it was for the best. "It would have been tough

making weight the second day of the tournament," he said. Now the rugged senior, who looks aggressive even when walking through the halls between rounds, says he'll stay at 189, where he defeated returning State seventh-place medalist Kyle Good of Indian Hills for the County championship.

"At least I won't have to be cutting so much weight all year," he said.

Of the Good bout, Sica said, "My coach [Scot Weaver] gave me a full game plan; he scouted him very well. "[Good is] strong up top, so coach said to work him on his feet and stick with our usual leg attack. He almost caught me on my back in the second period, so I had to let him go. When we got back to the middle, I reversed him. I sort of came off my hips and tripodded."

NOTES: The Sica stunner helped St. Joseph win its second straight team title, 195-193, over Indian Hills. The most ironic twist was a loss in the 145-pound quarterfinals by Mike Massenzio, who transferred from St. Joseph to Indian Hills for this school year. Westwood's Adriatik Bajrushi was behind on points when he pinned Massenzio in 4:09. To his credit, Massenzio won his next two bouts to finish fifth. . . . Also telling was an injury suffered by the Braves' Dan McDonnell, who had to forfeit his 130-pound

third-place consolation bout to Chris Merzeau of St. Joe's. . . . St. Joseph heavyweight Edgar Puzio won the big head-to-head battle, 13-4, over T.J. Hicks in the semis; and Sica's teammate, Mike Schifano, decisioned Hicks, 3-1, for third place with a steparound takedown.

Among third-place highlights, Becton's Mike Decio (103 pounds) tied Garfield's Rodney Yamet in regulation with a rockout reversal and single-legged him for the 4-2 overtime win. ... Fort Lee's Spike Kim also went into OT to win at 140. Ridgefield Park's Justin Zajicek pulled him into a cradle for the 8-8 tie, but slipped in overtime trying a snap-down takedown and Kim pinned in 5:38. ... Jason Fink's spin reversal in the second period earned the Paramus 112-pounder a 2-1 decision over North Bergen's Ron Palmieri.

Last year, eventual champions Palo and Hackensack's Chris Bitetto were well known through their junior wrestling prowess, but could not be seeded as freshmen without high school experience. To correct the situation this year, George Jockish's tournament committee added seeding criteria, making it possible for National Wrestling Federation place winners and New Jersey State Federation champions to be ranked.

The only time he seemed in danger of being taken down, Hult somehow caught a leg and headlocked to set up the pin.

112 — Takedowns on a low single-leg shot and a shrugand-around enabled PV's repeat champion Dave Germakian to build a 4-1 lead over Garfield's Anthony Barber. Then, after Barber chose the bottom position, Germakian locked in a nearside or bow-and-arrow cradle for the 3:42 pin.

119 — Older brother Ryan Hult of PV pinned Garfield's Jeff Alfonso in 5:09. Hult was caught in a leg lock, but caught Alfonso by the leg and worked around for a 4-0 lead. Takling the bottom position in the third period, he used a Peterson roll to turn the tables. PV, which won three individual titles, finished third overall behind St. Joseph and Inian Hills.

125 — Repeat champion Mike Palo, the St. Joseph sophomore, faced the fourth straight Pascack Valley wrestler to reach the finals, Justin Mezzadri. Palo had takedowns off single-leg trips, arm drags, and doubles-to-singles off duckunders for a 15-5 win.

130 — Ramsey's Chris Brizzi's third County championship was not an easy one over Elmwood Park's Paul Chiaramonte. The first point was on Chiaramonte's standup switch 31 seconds into the second period. Brizzi followed with a driving double-leg dump in the second and reversed in the third, rocking his man back for back points and a 6-1 win.

145 — Northern Valley at Demarest's John Lauterback was taken down in the first period by Don Bosco Prep's Paul Siemon with a single-leg spin, but rolled to an escape 29 seconds later and went from a single- to a double-leg for a takedown and the lead 28 seconds later, leading to a 4-2 win.

152 — Cliffside Park's Zeke Hernandez, who beat topseeded Ralph DeNisco of St. Joseph in the semis, topped Northern Valley at Old Tappan's second-seeded Mike D'Andrea, 13-7, with single-legs and spins, plus a double grapevine for back points.

Currid's driving trip takedown and a clasp gained a 3-1 lead, but Puzio's driving takedown made it 4-3 at the end of two. Currid's standup escape six seconds into the third tied it at 4-4 and he barely missed a takedown at the buzzer after Puzio countered two drags.



This boy's got poise

hris Bitetto, 4, was watching. His brother was five years older and preparing to wrestle. Completing the family triumvirate in the gym that day 11 years ago, their father was the junior wrestling coach for the Hackensack program.

"My dad put me in a singlet [wrestling uniform] and asked me if I wanted to go out there," says Chris Bitetto, now a Hackensack High School sophomore. He waited until the following year to become a junior wrestler.

Today, he is The Record's Athlete of the Week and the Most Outstanding Wrestler in the Bergen County Coaches Holiday tournament. In the 135-pound final, he recorded a remarkable 18-17 win over fellow State medal winner Justin Frohlich of Pascack Hills after trailing 12-3

cack Hills after trailing, 12-3.

"I had to be calm," the repeat champion recalls.
"In wrestling, you can't think, 'Man, I'm down 12-3 or 13-2.' You have to score fast, maybe catch him on his back, and pin him or at least narrow the score."

While concerned, his high school coaches — John Stallone and Ralph Dass — had faith. "Chris truly believes he is going to win," says Stallone. "And he

By sixth grade, Bitetto gave up baseball, and by eighth grade he was through with football in order to concentrate on wrestling. He won two State junior titles before high school and last year placed fourth in the State at 130 pounds as a freshman.

Dass mentioned the wrestler's incredible poise, admiring the fact that he did not force any moves against a powerful senior who was sixth in the State at 140 pounds last March.

Bitetto, who was fourth in the State at 130 pounds, credits many costars for his success. It begins with his mother, Darlene, who drives him to The Edge, a half hour away, for extra practices. "My mom washes all my sweaty clothes, puts me on a strict, healthy diet, and pushes me on. Without her in my life, I wouldn't be here. And I can't say enough about my dad [Frank]. He has shown me everything and always encourages me."


There's more. "I have lots of friends, but my two best friends are my sister and brother," he says of Brandi, 18, and Rich, 20, a former State high school champion for Hackensack. "If I need something, my sister is right there. And my brother's always been my idol. I've always looked up to him and wanted to be just like him. I don't think there's anyone in Bergen County or the State who doesn't like him."

Stallone, Dass, and his private coach, former State champion Pete Gonzalez, also draw praise. "If I don't push myself, I can count on them to push me to the furthest point in practice," the 5-foot-10 Bitetto says.

"Religion is important and Pete inspires me by telling me a story relating to God and the Bible," said Bitetto, who is Catholic. "I became poised in eighth grade because Pete and my father made me that way."

In 2001, it won't be surprising if Bitetto chooses to wrestle at Michigan. "I've been dreaming of going there since I was 7," he recalls. "I loved their football helmets, and their colors are similar to Hackensack's. [St. Joseph graduate] Damion Logan is a friend of my brother's and he loves it at Michigan. So I know it's a great school, too."
