Greenwald's ready for some heavy duty

RUTHERFORD - The basement cafeteria that doubles as a wrestling room at St. Mary's is looking a little smaller to David Greenwald this year.

The junior has grown a couple of inches since last year. Gone is that wispy look of an underclassman that belied the strength and ability that led to a pair of top-5 finishes in Atlantic City.

The determination that has accompanied Greenwald since he burst on the high school wrestling scene as a freshman phenom two years ago remains, however, and will be on display beginning today when he jumps three weight classes into the teeth of a 135-pound division that features two-time returning Holiday champ and State third-place finisher Sal Tirico of Lodi at the BCCA George Jockish Holiday Wrestling Tournament.

"What's the sense of being weak at a lighter weight when you can be strong at a good weight," said Greenwald, who won his first holiday championship last year at 119 pounds.

"I see a young man instead of a boy," Gaels coach Scot Weaver said. "He was not real focused, or he would only get focused when I was in his face or for the big matches. When you try to turn the switch like that, sometimes it doesn't come on when you expect it

The switch did not come on last year when he lost to Chris Notte of Holy Cross, 8-6, in the State quarterfinal. Greenwald came back the next day to beat Notte, 8-6, in overtime, to finish fifth in the state event, one step lower on the podium than the year before.

"Dave fell short of his goal last year," Weaver said. "He felt as we did that he should have won it. He was so sloppy against Notte, and then he comes back to beat him in the wrestleback for fifth."

"Last year, I put myself out of my game in the States," Greenwald said. "Once I lost, I knew there goes the State title, there goes a year of work. This is my year. I wrestled every weekend. I practiced two or three times a week. Every extra mile I ran was another 30 seconds I could go in double overtime in the State final."

And this is the year that Greenwald decided to stop cutting the 18 to 20 pounds he needed to stay at 119 pounds.

weight," said Greenwald, who finished eighth at 130 pounds at the Cadet National Freestyle Championships in July to earn All-America status. "Last year was extremely difficult. When I'd wake up every morning, it would take me five minutes to get out of bed. I've got more energy. I feel stronger. Even though I'm at 135 instead of 119, I feel lighter because I'm not trying to drop 8 pounds every day."

"Last year and as a freshman, he was battling the scale every day," Weaver said. "That's the dark side of wrestling. This year, he came in at 142 and we discussed whether he wanted to drop down to 130 or

The deciding factor for Greenwald was which weight class would be most challenging. At 135, he could expect to see Tirico and Gene Palko of Saddle Brook/Glen Rock, who was a regional runnerup in 2003. Weaver also thought there was a shot that returning State runner-up Cory Dunn of Rutherford might bump up to 135, although the senior will remain at 130 for the holiday tournament.

"I told him if he goes 135 in the County tournament, he could be the fourth, fifth, maybe the sixth seed," Weaver said. "That was part of his decision to choose 135. Does that mean he won't be at 130 by the end of the season? I don't know."

"I know it's a packed weight at the County," Greenwald said. "You have Tirico and Palko. I can't wait. The County is a big tournament, and it lets you know how you're going to do this year. My goal is to win the States.

He's hoping to take the first step this week.



Palko returns from major surgery to get to semis

TEANECK - Gene Palko stood up after his 7-0 victory over Kyle Antoine of Hasbrouck Heights/Wood-Ridge as if it were just another day at the office.

But those close to the senior from Saddle Brook/Glen Rock know differently, that that win in the quarterfinals of the BCCA Holiday Wrestling Tournament on Wednesday and his berth in this morning's semifinal against top-seeded Andrew Wagner of Ramsey is another victory of Palko's will.

It's the same will that helped him come back from major surgery a year ago to repair his one functioning kidney after falling hard while playing football at a friend's house.

"It feels great to be back,"

all year watching the team lose. But I punched through it."

"After he won his first match at the Cutter Classic, he went over and congratulated his mother and his father for their support," Saddle Brook/Glen Rock coach Chris Marren said. "What that kid went through needs to be told. Every match he wrestles is one more victory for him."

Palko was a regional runnerup as a sophomore and looking to improve as a junior when he shattered his kidney in October 2003. What he and his family didn't know was that his other kidney had never functioned since birth.

The 8-inch scar on his chest is a souvenir of the operation to repair the one working kidney.

Palko will tell the story to anybody who asks, but he'd prefer to

Palko said. "It was terrible sitting be remembered as a wrestler even with a regional second unwith a shot at a Holiday tournament championship and an eye on another trip to Atlantic City.

Palko barely broke a sweat in his first two bouts, pinning Bergenfield's Mike Kimmerle in 59 seconds and Marshall Keating of Leonia/Palisades Park in 1:30 before blanking Antoine, 7-0, in the quarterfinals.

"I want to place in the States," he said. "I thìnk it's a goal I can accomplish. I'm not as good as I was two years ago. I'm better. I've built myself back up this

Santaite, a runner-up to St. Joseph's John Trumbetti in this tournament and in the regional last year, pinned in 1:04 and again in 19 seconds in his first two bouts before beating Randy Strobel of Pascack Hills, 16-6, in the quarterfinals. For his troubles, he earned a date with one of the most highly touted freshman in the state. Joe Trause of Bergen Catholic, in today's semifinals.

"When I first saw who I had, I was kind of mad," Santaite said. "But then I got over it. I like the challenge of facing good guys because a win against them isn't like a regular win. I just have to go out there and beat him and show everybody."

Rebounds from loss in style

"I knew he was a tough wrestler, but we wrestled over the summer in the Westwood dual meets and I beat him in overtime. So I knew what I had to do to get the win," Buenafuente said," 1

was surprised that I pinned him there. It was a real close match.'

Buenafuente believes that his ride doesn't have to stop here.

"I know Dunn is a real good wrestler too, but I just have to go in there knowing what I want to do and I'll be fine," he said.

"Frank has just started to come around," said Garfield coach Todd Williams. "He had some success last year, and I think coming in to this year he was a little nervous about living up to expectations. He hasn't been showing what's he's capable of, but this was a big win for him and he's a good kid."


Williams said watching teammate Kyle Kutsup lose at 103 helped give Buenafuente some extra motivation.

"I wasn't really surprised that I beat him - I knew I could beat




Garfield's Frank Buenafuente lifting Bergen Catholic's Matt Morgensten in their 130-pound bout Wednesday night.

"It's a great feeling," Dabal said. "I knew I had to get the first takedown and ride him


out."

"At this level, every kid has the physical tools," Maietta said. "The difference is in their mind.





we showed them."


Sewell remembers wrestling as a 230pound freshman and getting beat by bigger and stronger heavyweights. Now he is a team leader on a Comets team primed for big things.
